Dear Mr. Corren,

I write in response to your letter dated July 19, 2018. As you know, the Attorney General's Office has provided you with over 300 pages of potentially responsive records in response to your public record act request dated June 20, 2018. We also directed you to hundreds of pages of publicly available records that are potentially responsive to your request. You have not been billed for any time spent processing your request to date (approximately four and a half hours).

In your most recent letter, you ask to be exempted from any charges "since the information is in the public interest." The Vermont Public Records Act does not exempt fees on such grounds. As permitted by the Act, AGO consistently charges fees for voluminous, time-intensive requests. We post all public record act requests, cost estimates, and productions on our website. For more information, please see: http://ago.vermont.gov/open-government/.

You have also asked for more information about how we developed our cost estimate in response to your June 20, 2018 request. More information about that estimate is below.

Search results following search for records containing ["Corren"] and/or ["Lieutenant Governor election" and "2014"] including Bill Sorrell records: 5,920 pages of potentially responsive records. If you have more specific search terms or are willing to narrow your search to reduce the volume of potentially responsive records that will need to be reviewed to process your request, please let us know.

As previously stated in our July 5, 2018, letter: Using a conservative estimate of two minutes per page, review of 5,900 pages will require 11,800 minutes or 196 hours of staff time. Using a middle rate permitted by the Secretary of State's Uniform Fee Schedule (recognizing that additional staff time could be billed at 5.57/minute under the Fee Schedule), the cost associated with this additional time will likely amount to at least: $11,800 \times 5.45$ a minute = 5.310. (As noted above, the Attorney General's Office has not charged for the first 4.5 hours associated with processing your request.)

Finally, to the extent not already provided, attached please find records produced to Brady Toensing following the remand of Toensing v. Attorney General. Please note, certain of the attached records were produced to Mr. Toensing for reasons unrelated to the remand, as set forth in Bill Griffin's letter to

Mr. Toensing dated April 27, 2018. Personal contact information has been redacted pursuant to 1 V.S.A. § 317(c)(7). If you feel information has been withheld in error, you may appeal to Deputy Attorney General Josh Diamond.

Dear Brady,

Enclosed please find a production of documents. The production includes documents from the personal Gmail account of Mr. Sorrell that could be considered responsive to your request. The inclusion within the production of a document is not an indication that it is a public record. Rather, both the AGO and Mr. Sorrell endeavored to take an inclusive to over—inclusive approach to identifying potentially responsive documents.

With respect to the personal Gmail account of Mr. Sorrell, Mr. Sorrell has, as we previously discussed, reviewed the decision of the Vermont Supreme Court in this case with counsel. After doing so, he conducted a manual review of documents containing your search terms, applying the public record definition set forth by the Vermont Supreme Court, which emphasized that "in order to qualify as a public record, a document must have been 'produced or acquired in the course of public agency business." *Toensing v. The Attorney General of Vermont*, 2017 VT 99 ¶ 22 (quoting 1 V.S.A. § 317(b)).

In order to avoid duplication, the production includes only documents that have not been previously produced to you from official state accounts. The production includes a total of two emails sent by Mr. Sorrell over the four years covered by your request from his personal Gmail account, one of which responded to an email by asking that the sender resend something to his official email account. It also includes approximately 10 emails a year received by Mr. Sorrell that are not also contained in official state accounts covered by your request.

As I informed you a few weeks ago, the records that the AGO provided to you in February, March and April of 2016 – from State of Vermont email accounts – did not include emails sent or received in 2011. This was due to an oversight by the information technology contractor who helped us respond to your requests. Since your original requests covered five years dating to 2011, we went back to the contractor and arranged for them to search the 2011 archival accounts of Mr. Sorrell and his executive assistant, Mary Kay Swanson. We asked them to identify and gather:

- 1. Emails sent from the William Sorrell State of Vermont account or from the Mary Kay Swanson State of Vermont account to any of the 27 individuals named on your list, or to individuals with email accounts at Senator Sanders Senate Office, at Senator Sanders campaign office or at the office of the Democratic Attorney Generals Association; and
- 2. Emails sent from any of the 27 individuals named on your list, or from individuals with email accounts at Senator Sanders offices or at the DAGA office, to the Sorrell or Swanson State of Vermont accounts.

In response to our request, the contractor identified and gathered the following emails sent in 2011 from the Sorrell and Swanson State of Vermont accounts to the persons on your list:

- Mr. Sorrell sent 2 emails to Todd Bailey, neither of them in the course of agency business.

Judicial Activism and the Affordable Care Act

Today, a judge in Florida issued a decision in a case filed by 25 Republican Attorneys General and Governors striking down the Affordable Care Act. This ruling is well out of the mainstream of judicial opinion. Twelve federal judges have already dismissed challenges to the constitutionality of the health reform law, and two judges in the Eastern District of Michigan and Western District of Virginia – have upheld the law. In one other case, a federal judge in the Eastern District of Virginia issued a very narrow ruling on the constitutionality of the health reform law's "individual responsibility" provision and upheld the rest of the law.

Today's ruling – issued by Judge Vinson in the Northern District of Florida – is a plain case of judicial overreaching. The judge's decision contradicts decades of Supreme Court precedent that support the considered judgment of the democratically elected branches of government that the Act's "individual responsibility" provision is necessary to prevent billions of dollars of cost-shifting every year by individuals without insurance who cannot pay for the health care they obtain. And the judge declared that the entire law is null and void even though the only provision he found unconstitutional was the "individual responsibility" provision. This decision is at odds with decades of established Supreme Court law, which has consistently found that courts have a constitutional obligation to preserve as a much of a statute as can be preserved. As a result, the judge's decision puts all of the new benefits, cost savings and patient protections that were included in the law at risk.

Under today's view of the law, seniors will pay higher prices for their prescription drugs and small businesses will pay higher taxes because small business tax credits would be eliminated. And the new provisions that prevent insurance companies from denying, capping or limiting your care would be wiped away.

We don't believe this kind of judicial activism will be upheld and we are confident that the Affordable Care Act will ultimately be declared constitutional by the courts.

History and the facts are on our side. Similar legal challenges to major new laws -- including the Social Security Act, the Civil Rights Act, and the Voting Rights Act -- were all filed and all failed. And contrary to what opponents

argue the new law falls well within Congress's power to regulate economic activity under the Commerce Clause, the Necessary and Proper Clause, and the General Welfare Clause.

Those who claim that the "individual responsibility" provision exceeds Congress' power to regulate interstate commerce because it penalizes "inactivity" are simply wrong. Individuals who choose to go without health insurance are actively making an economic decision that impacts all of us. People who make an economic decision to forego health insurance do not opt out of the health care market. As Congress found, every year millions of people without insurance obtain health care they cannot pay for, shifting tens of billions of dollars in added cost onto those who have insurance and onto taxpayers. There can be no doubt that this activity substantially affects interstate commerce, and Congress has the power to regulate it.

The Affordable Care Act, through the individual responsibility requirement, will require everyone, if they can afford it, to carry some form of health insurance since everyone at some point in time participates in the health care system, and incur costs that must be paid for. For the 83% of Americans who have coverage and who are already taking responsibility for their health care, their insurance premiums will decrease over time. Many of those who are currently struggling to pay for insurance will get a new tax credit. Only those who are able to pay for health insurance will be responsible for obtaining it. Because most people would voluntarily purchase coverage as it becomes more affordable and the policy exempts those for whom purchase would cause a financial hardship, the Congressional Budget Office estimated that only 1 percent of all Americans would pay a penalty for not having health insurance in 2016.

The Affordable Care Act also bans insurance companies from discriminating against people with pre-existing conditions. However, unless every American is required to have insurance, it would be cost prohibitive to cover people with pre-existing conditions.

Here's why: If insurance companies can no longer deny coverage to anyone who applies for insurance — especially those who have health problems and are potentially more expensive to cover — then there is nothing stopping someone from waiting until they're sick or injured to apply for coverage since insurance companies can't say no. That would lead to double digit premiums increases — up to 20% — for everyone with insurance, and would significantly increase the cost health care spending nationwide.

We don't let people wait until after they've been in a car accident to apply for auto insurance and get reimbursed, and we don't want to do that with healthcare. If we're going to outlaw discrimination based on pre-existing conditions, the only way to keep people from gaming the system and raising costs on everyone else is to ensure that everyone takes responsibility for their own health insurance.

Two federal courts and more than 100 constitutional scholars agree with these arguments. And representatives from important organizations like the American Cancer Society Action Network, the American Diabetes Association, the American Hospital Association and the American Nurses Association have all filed amicus briefs in similar cases supporting the Administration's position. Event President Reagan's Solicitor General Charles Fried has written, "the health care law's enemies have no ally in the Constitution."

In the end, we're confident our arguments will carry the day and the health reform law will continue to make the health care system stronger for all of us.

Thanks for giving me an excellent reason to reconnect with Josh re: your potential SCt cert. He and I spoke for about an hour on Friday—he is conflicted out of the case, bec/ he represents a lot of journalistic entities. He made the point that the First Amendment bar is unforgiving about folks switching sides on various cases, and he knows this case would set precedent he'd be arguing against in the future, if you win. He knows and respects the attorney who argued the other side in both circuits.

He also noted that the case will be flooded with amici, as you noted, but from his client cohort: it is the situation, according to josh, that these datamining companies are often owned by or through subsidiary interests of media interests, and, of course, they are huge into these types of cases. In addition, he predicts that you will see many interests on the other side lining up because this datamining is the profit model for internet advertising-based companies (cookies, consumer profiles, etc.), and they go out of their way to get involved in any case that may smack of expanding privacy in information-gathering contexts.

Josh opined that the argument you make has a public interest pull that even he is sympathetic to (see note re: the reach of Internet information collectors and marketers into the laptops of America, supra...), but he thinks on the whole you "should" lose this one. He seemed genuinely bummed he was conflicted out—he does a ton of pro bono work now that he works for himself. (A good life—he told me he bills only about a quarter of the hours he used to when in a large law firm, makes more money, has more time for even more good stuff (he is writing a book on media law), and works out of his home in the city limits of San Francisco. Nice.)

If you are still looking for someone, I say you go to 1st Amend/con law prof Bill Marshall at UNC.

Bill-

Here are the long overdue documents for prep on what you could speak to next week for filming the tobacco primer for our work with Legacy. The audience here is all AGs, yes, and specifically the new ones. This will be more for senior staff who are trying to prioritize issues in their respective offices, and Legacy wants to make sure that tobacco is not seen only as yesterday's fight.

Recall that we were asked to work with Legacy on NON-MSA issues, i.e., they are well aware of the many efforts on MSA, and wanted to draw the attention of the AGs to jurisdiction at the state level that is non-MSA related. First and foremost is the 2009 law expanding FDA jurisdiction and what it allows/leaves to states. Those issues are contained in the two documents I attach. If you need something more truncated, let me know.

The attached talking points are too long on background but were created for a slightly different purpose, so please forgive length—pages 1 thru 3 are the most pertinent. The second document was done by Doug Blanke's shop (former AAG who worked on tobacco issues) who is now at William Mitchell Law in MN and their Health Care Law Center; his colleague is the woman you and I heard present at the Memphis meeting. Their documents are very good, actually—better than the presentation.

I know you and I need to discuss, especially in light of the fact that all of the AGs should be focused on the arbitration activity after the impassioned plea of McDaniel and Bruning at the winter NAAG meeting.... My feeling is that Legacy will have an uphill battle getting AGs to focus on what else they could be doing, but still, for those AGs who wish to do something preventative, proactive, noncombative and, for the most part, non-litigious to work on health/tobacco issues, these are good issues to focus on.

Your value added (yeah, I hate that phrase, but it works here) is having you present an institutional memory framework about where the tobacco fights started, where they are, and how the next phases will include non-MSA issues as the anti-tobacco movement works on other fronts. Your passion about anti-tobacco efforts and taking the issue on, in new contexts as well as old, is what we need from you. We will leave to others explaining the specifics (which are included in the attached docs). Happy to have you speak for 15-20 minutes, and if you want to do more, all the better.

Again, I am sure we should discuss your own views and thoughts on what you'd like to explain as the highlights. An AG speaking to AGs and senior staff will go a long way.

Ellen-

Here are some 30,000-foot talking points that could be used by Cheryl in Memphis (or anywhere else she happens to be around AGs or AAGs...) I don't know whether she will be speaking prior or subsequent to the FDA panel.

One aspect to note about the audience is that the AAGs will be the ones who have been in the trenches on the MSA and DE efforts, but, as we've discussed, they may very well not be the AAGs who would be involved in some of the state efforts under the new Act- may be elsewhere in the AG office. On the one hand, Cheryl will be preaching to the choir, on the other hand, these AAGs need to go spread the word to their respective offices that others will need to be engaged (especially on aspects dealing with formulation of new legislation and regs).

These are true talking points- no flowery langauge, just the two-minute message:

- 1) New day dawning on the next generation of tobacco use prevention and enforcement, and state attorneys general are, and need to be, key players.
- The 2009 law, combined with federal grants that have flowed to states in 2010 due to health reform means there is **enormous renewed activity and energy at the state level** in combatting tobacco usage. AGs will be needed on both the front end of new laws and regulations, and on the litigation and enforcement ends after states take action. **Please stay-- or get-- involved in these new efforts.**
- 2) The 2009 law not only granted the federal government new oversight and regulation, in addition:
- states **retained their prior jurisdiction** to enact tobacco tax hikes, smoke-free laws in workplace, sales restrictions, regulations to prevent tobacco marketing that encourages youth initation or impedes cessation;
- the **law overtly granted states new authority** to regulate retail sales and marketing of tobacco products. Where the states had been preempted earlier by prior federal law as to certain restrictions, the new Act allows states much leeway in regulating time, manner and place of cigarette advertising and promotion. Trememndous new opportunities now that some of the previous preemption concerns have been swept away.

3) How will this translate to attorneys generals?

- Will offer opportunities for proactive work with state departments of health and state legislative branches to formulate new policies, laws and regulations that are permitted by the 2009 Act; AGs offices will be needed to help draft these laws and regulations such that they will withstand the inevitable legal challenges to be brought by the tobacco companies.

-Will require attorneys general to be aware of and defend against legal challenges based on the triumvirate utilized by the tobacco companies:

- -First Amendment
- -preemption
- -commerce clause

4) What can /should an attorney general's office do?

- Be in close contact with your state department of health as to new efforts under the Act;
- Make sure the AG's office is aware of state legislation, proposed or passed, pursuant to the new Act;
- Get up to speed on cases that are percolating up through municipalities or states; many will be test cases and may offer amicus opportunities;
- Utilize the resources already out there that can help your office get up to speed and get you connected to the many stakeholders brought together by these current efforts:

-Legacy itself;

-William Mitchell Law School's Public Health Program, which has excellent on-line resources (and

a nod to Maggie Mahoney from Mitchell, who will be present);

-Columbia Law School's National State Attorney General's Program, which is working with both Legacy and Mitchell Law to produce materials tailored to AGs and AAGs on the new opportunities and challenges presented by the Act (I will be present as well).

Should I gush again? Nah. You'll get a big head.

I just sent you my talking points i'd given to Cheryl Healton on the fly last October, in preparation for her speech in Memphis. See below as to why I sent them--

My four comments on your outline, apart from the "let me count the ways" initial moment:

1) Please, for our sake, it would be appreciated if you are a bit cautious about how (tone) you speak of the FDA and its actions/inactions/passivity/amorphousness. The first time Jim ever spoke to Legacy, he started talking about the FDA and its issues, and Legacy got its back up. They have worked hard to have a good relationship with FDA and regularly employ someone to do that, so naturally they don't love hearing anyone diss them. Now, certainly I am not trying to quash or even chill your God-given AG First Amendment rights to say whatever you want, but note I will have to explain it away if you do.

My own suggestion is that you note that AGs may act with or without FDA guidance, although once that guidance comes thru, even more helpful. The FDA has not made clear what it wants/needs/its perspective as to preferred AG action, but here is what an AG could do contigent upon hearing X or Y. Alternatively, you may say it doesn't really matter what the FDA wants AGs to do, which will feed the conservative AGs out there, too, and the AG authority is the same. Granted, it will grease the rails if the FDA made it clear or helped in all the ways it could, but technically, not required at this point, of course (and if the FDA doesn't act more agressively, AGs won't get that help anyway any time soon). Let's also pretend, hypothetically, that there is a President Palin and her VP Mitch Daniels (I actually think it could be Bloomberg/Daniels, but I digress, and he'd be fore this effort...): until the FDA jhurisdiction is rolled back, AGs ahve certain authority now they can exercise, with or without FDA guidance.

- 2) Would love to have a bit more background on how Legacy was formed, why it has its place in the universe that it does, the types of other groups it works with that serve as resources to AGs.
- 3) Could you discuss a bit of where AGs would find the proper skill sets in their offices to do this type of work, i.e., who they DON'T necessarily need (the AAGs currently tasked with MSA financial litigation, DE, etc., although it would be great to have them on a working group within the office for perspective, perhaps), and what they can use: the folks who get policy, how to work WITH the feds and local gov'ts, policy types who know a good issue ripe for litigation and passing off to a litigator when needed (pre-emption issues), etc. With state budgets as they are, pretend an AG wants to get in this area and asks how much of a time suck? Who would I use and who do I need? Any other logistical/HR/fiscal/political issues from an AG perspective?
- 4) It would be helpful if you would address some very specific areas under the new FDA law (in the research memo I sent you from our intern at Columbia) where AGs can get involved and should be paying attention, even if nothing proactive. These same few points were stressed in the talking points I sent Healton—the email I just sent you.

That's it. I think our new fundraiser might be there to watch you film. He's trying to get a feel for what we do-- the package he will be selling, as it were. Most folks I film (except for me) find it easier to have someone as an audience member to speak to, apart from just the camera.

We hope to hear during the early part of January (probably January 7) whether the US Supreme Court will hear an appeal of an adverse 2d Circuit decision that struck down a VT law restricting data mining companies' access, absent physician permission, to physician pharmaceutical prescribing records. (Cert petition is attached.) The 1st Circuit has upheld similar Maine and NH laws. If cert is granted, we will be on a very fast track to put together our brief and obtain amici assistance. The briefs would be due in February and the argument would be in April.

Since the case is shaping up as potentially a major statement on commercial free speech, there is the possibility that many consumer and public health groups as well as the federal govt (FDA restrictions on tobacco advertising, HHS concerns about medical records privacy and the burgeoning costs of pharmaceuticals), we're trying to sweep broadly for amici support - law schools, legal scholars, med schools, schools of public health, consumer protection and public health groups et al. We had AARP and the New England Journal of Medicine with us at the 2d Circuit. I know that some of the public health groups take pharmaceutical industry \$, so they might be reluctant to fight the industry in this case.

I will be reaching out to some groups and individuals, e.g. Tobacco Free Kids, ACS, certain of the states. We might be asking Illinois to draft a states' brief.

I will be trying to get a meeting with the SG's office, probably through Ed Kneedler.

So, a few requests:

- 1. Brainstorm a bit as to possible amici groups or organizations and provide contact information.
- 2. There are some law school deans (Yale et al.) who have indicated a willingness to sign onto a brief, but don't have time to write one. Some of the

other potential amici (VT, ME and NH Medical Societies) would be in the same boat - and would

likely want to avoid a bunch of legal expense. Any good

researchers and writers who might volunteer pro bono to draft a brief for one or other of the amici? Professor Lott, are you dying to write a commercial free speech brief???

- 3. Any one(s) come to mind who might be willing to make some phone calls to drum up support from colleagues, the usual suspects, others?
 - 4. Other suggestions? Advice?

I'm sure I'm forgetting some things but responding to the above would be much appreciated.

Issues regarding election law, \$\$ in the system, conflicts of interest, conflicts between governor/AG, independence of the AG, etc. It just sets horrible precedent, in my opinion.

But then, I don't have to figure out how to staff such a suit, as you do. The reality is that unless you are willing to take a public stand against it, someone cld set it up, make public the offer, and you'll be railroaded into taking it. I'd figure this out ASAP so the gov"s office knows where you stand. This is not a public fight you want, unless you truly, truly want it, for good PR and above- (and below-) stated policy and ethical reasons. If you can still staff the suit without it, maybe it is a fight worth having in public, if your constituents hear and understand the real implications, and you come out the good guy. But if all they hear is \$\$, I would not choose this as a public fight you need to have.

Go with God or nip it in the bud, but ASAP. My 2 cents.

And as I said to the Governor's legal counsel, if you like the issue/case we take \$ for today, you might well be appalled by the next.

Since she's gay, I mentioned a marriage case or some other civil rights matter, state funding of education, etc. etc. And what happens when two competing organizations offer funding, depending on how/what the state argues?

And what about disclosure of donors - who and how much? Going forward, will wealthy interests be able to have major impacts on state enforcement and/or defense efforts?

I'm just not sure I can tell them to find the \$ elsewhere to pay for outside counsel for the likely appeal of the PI decision. My folks are preparing for a Sept 12 trial date and came to me suggesting the potential need for outside counsel with a PI decision likely coming within a few weeks.

I think it is terrible policy, for all of the obvious reasons, none of which means you can't, won't or shouldn't do it. Whatever you are doing this time around, someone else can do for an odious lawsuit in the future. When not in recession, budget allocations were meant to indicate priorities in some way for a government. Once we get private folks who say "here's the \$\$,

what's stopping you?", we have problems (maybe less in VT than other states, but I'm not entirely convinced of that, either). But you know all of that.

These types of support are here to stay, no matter the legal form they may take will change eventually. The recession just exacerbated the trend.

You'll have a difficult time arguing against this for such a large suit.



The National State Attorneys General Program's Charities Law Project, led by Senior Counsel Cindy Lott, convened a wide range of participants for a conference on the subject of social mission / hybrid organizations, a topic of increasing importance as states propose and adopt new organizational forms blending charitable and for-profit missions and methods. Attendees of the June 28-29 meeting and webinar filming session included attorneys from the Federal Trade Commission; state regulators from offices of attorneys general and secretaries of state; members of the academic community representing Harvard University, George Washington University and Brooklyn Law School; and members of the private sector who advise and represent business/nonprofit entities. In addition, the Charities Project hosted a private session in which state regulators discussed related topics and specific case studies.

Hybrid entities, which may take many different shapes and names—including low profit liability companies, benefit corporations, and flexible purpose organizations—pose a variety of challenges to state and federal officials in the areas of charities regulation, consumer protection, taxes, and business.

associations. The meeting supplied participants with a review of the economic and legal contexts for hybrid organizations, regulators' jurisdiction over hybrids, and the policy implications of current and future state legislative activity in this area. California, which has three pending bills that would establish new hybrid forms, was examined in particular detail as a case study. Regulators then conveyed their observations and concerns as part of a facilitated question and answer session and accompanying lively discussion.

The June 29 webinar, which will soon be publicly available at the Charities Project's website at stateag.org/charities, was designed to provide a base of information for states seeking to develop and improve their regulation of social mission / hybrid organizations, and highlighted several of the conference's featured experts. The webinar touched on regulators' jurisdiction over hybrid organizations; the origins, purpose, and characteristics (legal or otherwise) of these entities; and issues of concern for the sector, regulators, and private attorneys.

DAGA TALKING POINTS

2011/2012 Political Landscape

- The current partisan breakdown among attorneys general is 24 Democrats to 26 Republicans.
- Thanks to your support DAGA raised and spent more than \$4 million on races in 2010.
- Ten Democratic incumbents won reelection (AR, DE, IA, IL, MA, MD, MN, NM, NV, and VT).
- New Democratic Attorneys General took office in CA, CT, HI, NY and RI.
- Democratic incumbents were upset in Kansas and Ohio while Republicans picked up held open seats in Arizona, Georgia and Oklahoma. While they came up short it is important to note that our candidates in AZ, OH and KS outperformed all other statewide candidates.
- The 2011/2012 cycle brings us 14 elections (13 popularly elected and ME elected by the Legislature).
- In 2011 two Democratic attorneys general are seeking reelection (Jack Conway and Jim Hood). Party switcher Buddy Caldwell (R) will also seek reelection in Louisiana.
- After gaining broad statewide recognition during his run for U.S. Senate Jack Conway is seeking a second term against Republican Todd P'Pool. P'Pool is a County Attorney who decided to run after Secretary of State Trey Greyson, considered the strongest contender, chose to post to private sector.
- In his bid for a third term Attorney General Jim Hood (D) will face State Public Safety
 Commissioner Steve Simpson (R). Simpson was appointed by Gov. Haley Barbour in
 April 2008 and was encouraged by Gov. Barbour and the Republican Party to challenge
 General Hood.
- Attorney General Buddy Caldwell (R) switched parties in early February 2011. Because of Louisiana's nonpartisan primary system General Caldwell will likely face both Democrats and Republicans leading up to the November election. The primary election will be held on October 22nd for all candidates regardless of party affiliation. Unless one candidate breaks 50% the top two candidates will move on to a general election on November 19th. Louisiana candidates have until early September 2011 to file.
- In 2012 DAGA will defend as many as 6 Democratic incumbents in MO, MT, NC, OR, VT, and WV. (MT AG General Bullock is still considering a gubernatorial bid).
- DAGA also has two important "pick up" opportunities in PA and WA.

- Former Pennsylvania Attorney General Tom Corbett (R) was elected Governor in 2010 and announced his replacement, Linda Kelly, in February 2011. Ms. Kelly is awaiting Senate confirmation, and has already announced she will not seek election in 2012. A strong Democratic candidate (in a presidential year) will make this an excellent pick up opportunity for Democrats. A number of Democrats including former Philadelphia DA Lynn Abraham are considering bids.
- Washington Attorney General Rob McKenna (R) is expected to run for Governor in 2012 leaving an open seat race for Attorney General. Republican Reagan Dunn is expected to run while Democrats are sorting through a long list of potential candidates.
- DAGA is excited for the coming campaign season as our strong Democratic incumbents stand with energized new candidates. DAGA looks forward to the next two years and reclaiming the majority of attorney general offices across the country.
- But we can only spread the word about our outstanding incumbents and candidates if we have the resources to compete with the Republicans and their many third party allies.
