I am writing to you to file a complaint about a potential violation of campaign finance laws in Vermont. The complaint is in regards to the Vermont Democratic Party, and candidates John Bartholomew and Paul Belaski.

A postcard was sent out before the primary elections encouraging voters to vote for Paul and John in the Windsor-1 district. The postcard was distributed widely throughout the district. I have attached the postcard for you to review. The postcard says that it is paid for by the Paul Belaski and John Bartholomew campaigns for House of representatives. However after reviewing July and August campaign expense reports from both John and Paul(Attached), there is no indication that John paid for the postcard at all, and Paul's expense report only attributed \$163 for postage, which would not have covered the full expense of printing and mailing the postcards across the district. Furthermore in an email chain which I have copied and pasted below John states "I actually have not seen the postcard to which you refer. I believe it was sent out by the Democratic House Campaign."

I am filing a complaint because I believe the Vermont Democratic Party violated campaign finance laws by sending out a postcard on the behalf of both candidates and saying that it was paid for by the candidate's campaign even though it was paid for and prepared by the Vermont Democratic Party. There is a serious lack of transparency here and a lack of accountability of where the funds came from to pay for this. My complaint is against the Vermont Democratic Party and not against the candidates as I believe, as was indicated in John's email, that they had no involvement in its creation or mailing.





Hello,
I am writing to you to file a complaint about a potential violation of campaign finance laws in Vermont. The complaint in regards to the Vermont Democratic Party, and candidates John Bartholomew and Paul Belaski.

A postcard was sent out before the primary elections encouraging voters to vote for Paul and John in the Windsor-1 district. The postcard was distributed widely throughout the district. I have attached the postcard for you to review. The postcard says that it is paid for by the Paul Belaski and John Bartholomew campaigns for House of representatives. However after reviewing July and August campaign expense reports from both John and Paul(Attached), there is no indication that John paid for the postcard at all, and Paul's expense report only attributed \$163 for postage, which would not have covered the full expense of printing and mailing the postcards across the district. Furthermore in an email chain which I have copied and pasted below John states "I actually have not seen the postcard to which you refer. I believe it was sent out by the Democratic House Campaign."

I am filing a complaint because I believe the Vermont Democratic Party violated campaign finance laws by sending out a postcard on the behalf of both candidates and saying that it was paid for by the candidate's campaign even though it was paid for and prepared by the Vermont Democratic Party. There is a serious lack of transparency here and a lack of accountability of where the funds came from to pay for this. My complaint is against the Vermont Democratic Party and not against the candidates as I believe, as was indicated in John's email, that they had no involvement in its creation or mailing.






