I am writing in response to your request for records, which the Vermont Attorney General's Office ("AGO") received on April 11, 2019.

Request

You have requested document and other records that the AGO has in connection with the investigation of alleged threats and harassment of former Rep. Kiah Morris.

Response

The AGO has located records in its possession that appear responsive to your request. The records listed below are subject to production and inspection and enclosed with this response. Some information within these records has been redacted pursuant to 1 V.S.A. § 317(c)(5)(A)(iii). Specifically, this includes the redaction of personal or identifying information for persons involved in the investigation. In addition, pursuant to 1 V.S.A. § 317(c)(4), we have withheld records where disclosure would violate the attorney-client privilege. This includes

legal memoranda and emails between attorneys within the AGO. Finally, as you may be aware, Max Misch has been arraigned on criminal charges which are currently pending. Consistent with 1 V.S.A. § 317(c)(5)(A)(ii), because some records, including a timeline provided by Ms. Morris, contained information that could deprive Max Misch of his right to a fair trial, we were obliged, at this stage, to exempt or redact this material from disclosure. Pursuant to 1 V.S.A. § 317(c)(3) disclosure could also violate duly adopted Vermont Rules of Professional Conduct. Specifically, Rule 3.6 of the Vermont Rules of Professional Conduct prohibits a lawyer from making an extrajudicial statement that would have a substantial likelihood of materially prejudicing an adjudicative proceeding.

The records the AGO has in its possession that appear to fall within the scope of your request are listed below. These are 175 documents consisting primarily of emails (items 1-4), as well as records related to this investigation that have already been made public and have been posted on our website (item 5).

BENNINGTON — Democratic officials were concerned on Tuesday after an envelope of racist images was slid under the door of their campaign field office in Bennington.

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Conor Casey, executive director of the Vermont Democratic Party, said copies of the images have been sent to U.S. Attorney for the District of Vermont Eric Miller, who is looking into the case.

There were four images in total: one simply depicting Republican presidential candidate Donald Trump in front of a U.S. flag with the caption "Trump 2016;" one displaying a version of the cartoon frog Pepe, as a caricature of a Jewish man with a Star of David yarmulke, smiling while standing in front of the burning World Trade Center; one with Pepe, this time depicted as Trump, standing on one side of a fence, with characters depicting Mexican and Muslim stereotypes on the other side, while Russian President Vladimir Putin looks on approvingly with the caption, "This Trump guy, I like him;" and finally, a cartoon version of Trump speaking with a Mexican woman, who tells him that he cannot separate her from her baby, who is attached to an anchor chained to her body. Trump responds, "No problem," and hurls and the woman and her baby over what is labeled the "Great Wall of Trump."

Aaron Sawyer, who works at the Bennington office, called the action "aggressive" and "unusual."

Casey said this was the second similar incident over the last few weeks across the state. In the first, he said, imagery related to the Ku Klux Klan was mailed from an address in Delaware. This incident, he said, is more disturbing, as the perpetrator is obviously someone within the community.

"It's a pretty horrific election season," he said, "with the vitriol and the casual racism being thrown around." He said some volunteers have felt threatened by this and similar behavior, but that, "I don't think it's going to be enough to dissuade people to come in."

Pepe made headlines earlier this campaign season, when Democratic candidate Hillary Clinton's team posted an article on her website in September attempting to explain the connection. "Here's the short version: Pepe is a cartoon frog who began his internet life as an innocent meme enjoyed by teenagers and pop stars alike," it reads. "But in recent months, Pepe's been almost entirely co-opted by the white supremacists who call themselves the 'altright.' They've decided to take back Pepe by adding swastikas and other symbols of anti-semitism and white supremacy."

Bennington Rep. Kiah Morris, a Democrat who is black, was targeted on Twitter by a Bennington resident and Trump supporter earlier this year, who posted a caricature of a black man with the caption, "S—, I be representin dem white m—f— of Bennington, gnome sayin?"

That action was roundly denounced by political figures across the state, including Gov. Peter Shumlin, also a Democrat, who said, "There is no place for racism or racist vitriol in Vermont or anywhere else. Following up on our conversation from earlier.....

Morris contacted the Bennington Police and the Capitol Police concerning the issues with her computers. She opted to have the Bennington Police Department handle the investigation with the computers. On July 28, 2018, at approximately 1216 hours, Lawton and Morris dropped the computers off at the Bennington Police Department. Corporal Christopher Lauzon took possession of the computers and placed them in the temporary evidence room at approximately 1700 hours.

On July 30, 2018, Detective Sergeant Cole notified Officer Michael Sharshon the computers were in temporary evidence. Officer Sharshon attempted to obtain the passwords from Morris without success. On August 20, 2018, Officer Sharshon obtained the passwords from Kiah Morris. Within hours of obtaining the passwords, James Lawton presented himself in the lobby of the Bennington Police Department and spoke with Officer Michael Pierce. Lawton demanded the computers be returned to him as the investigation was taking too long. The computers were not returned to him and were subsequently delivered to the Vermont State Police on August 22, 2018, for analysis.

Within **two days** of obtaining the passwords, the computers were delivered to the Vermont State Police by Officer Michael Sharshon. The delay was on the part of Morris. The computers were analyzed by the Vermont State Police and returned to Morris directly. I understand a trooper hand delivered the computers to her at her residence.

In response to the allegations concerning the Bennington Police Department failing to assist Representative Ruqaiyah Morris, I feel it necessary to explain the position of the Bennington Police Department and all of our efforts to assist Representative Morris and her family. All of the complaints filed by Representative Morris and her husband James have been investigated appropriately and efficiently.

In September 2016, I had meetings with Representative Morris and James Lawton concerning possible threats against Representative Morris. Neither James nor Representative Morris wished to file a police report at the time and asked that I be aware of the perceived threats. I passed the information along to members of the Bennington Police Department and directed the staff to increase patrols in the area of their residence.

In October 2016, Representative Morris and James Lawton filed a complaint against an individual for threats. The matter was investigated by the Bennington Police Department, reviewed and there was not sufficient evidence to bring criminal charges forward.

From this time until July 2018, the Bennington Police Department did not receive any complaints from Representative Morris or James Lawton concerning threatening behavior. On July 27, 2018, a friend of Representative Morris contacted me at the Bennington Police Department and said Representative Morris was upset with me because I failed to return a call to her husband, James Lawton. In fact I never received a telephone call from Lawton nor had he left any messages for me. I telephoned Representative Morris and spoke with her directly.

Representative Morris advised me she and her husband were being threatened again. She further advised she reported the threats to the Capitol Police in Montpelier. Representative Morris advised her husband James would like to talk with me. I advised her I would assign an officer to contact James. Representative Morris did contact me later and advised she spoke with James and he advised her he never called me or left a message.

Officer Michael Sharshon made several attempts to contact James Lawton. Officer Sharshon was able to speak with James about threats and possible hacking of his computer. Representaive Morris emailed screen shots of information directly to me and I forwarded the information to the investigating officer. Officer Sharshon completed a report and sent the information to the Bennington County State's Attorney's Office for review.

Both computers were taken as evidence and were held at the Bennington Police Department. The investigating officer had Representative Morris sign a consent to search the computers but she did not provide the passcodes. Representative Morris advised the investigation officer she would speak with her husband and then contact the officer with the passcodes. Several days passed and Representative Morris failed to provide the passcodes. I received a call from a representative at the Vermont Attorney General's Office inquiring about the computers. The computers were still in the Bennington Police Department evidence room as we did not have the passcodes. The investigating officer went back to the residence and obtained the passcodes from Representative Morris.

Within a few hours of the passcodes being provided by Representative Morris, James Lawton presented himself at the Bennington Police Department requesting the immediate return of the computers. The computers were not returned to him. The investigating officer drove the computers to Waterbury and delivered them to the Vermont State Police for analysis.

Bennington County State's Attorney Erica Marthage and I conversed about this case several times and felt the case best be handled by the Vermont Attorney General's Office. At the time I spoke with State's Attorney Marthage, we only had the information from James Lawton and screen shots of information provided by Representative Morris. I didn't feel there was sufficient evident to charge anyone with a crime. State's Attorney Erica Marthage and I both conversed with a representative from the Vermont Attorney General's Office.

Like many other municipal law enforcement agencies, the Bennington Police Department does not have a computer forensics investigation unit. The computers had to be sent to the Vermont State Police and that was accomplished once the passcodes were obtained.

On August 31, 2018, I met with an investigator with the Vermont State Police and provided all of the reports and documents we had pertaining to this investigation. These are the same documents that were provided to the Bennington County State's Attorney's Office and the Vermont Attorney General's Office.

No further details about this investigation may be released at this time pending the investigation of the Vermont State Police.



Subject: A note on potentially threatening communications

Greetings!

We have received some inquiries lately from members about nasty, and occasionally threatening communications. I wanted to provide you some context and a primer on what to do when you receive these communications.

First, <u>if you feel like you are in immediate danger</u>, your first call should always be to 911, no matter where you are and no matter what role you are in. Immediate danger could be anything from someone saying to you "I'm on my way over to do 'x' to you" or someone showing up to confront you at your home, business or in public. <u>To our knowledge, no one in the General Assembly, or any staff member has been threatened in such a manner.</u>

If you receive communication that you believe is threatening, please retain that communication (Save the voice mail, etc) and contact either the Capitol Police or your local law enforcement agency. The decision between calling us or your local agency really rests with if you believe that the communication arises as part of your official capacity. If it is connected to your official position or job, please contact us immediately. Regardless of the nature, if you contact your local law enforcement agency, please ask them to keep us informed - it is important for us to have a clear picture of the threat matrix against our facility and personnel. If you contact us, we will work the case and assist you through the process.

I should take a moment here and mention suspicious letters and packages. I have attached a PDF to this e-mail that tells you what to look for. If you receive suspicious mail, don't handle it and call for help. <u>To our knowledge</u>, no one in the General Assembly, or any staff member has received anything like this.

Now that I have told you twice that no one has received these things, I will say that we have worked an unprecedented, <u>but still very small</u>, number of cases in 2018 involving real and perceived threats to members and staff. With this being an election season, I have to remind you that people will say not-nice things about candidates and those around them. Occasionally, those comments have crossed the line. There is currently a spate of e-mail based bomb threats plaguing government agencies across the country. Additionally, we have received calls within the State House that were directed at our elected US Representatives. The Capitol Police take these calls seriously, and work with our State, Local and Federal Law Enforcement Agencies to analyze, assess and resolve these incidents. We will always be here to assist you in a threat analysis, but it is important that we see the whole picture and try to connect loose ends. To that end, I encourage you to report odd and suspicious phone calls, messages and such.

BENNINGTON — On a December day two years ago, then-state Rep. Kiah Morris walked into a Bennington courtroom to face the man she accused of harassing her online because of her race.

Morris, Vermont's only female African American lawmaker, complained that Max Misch had been tweeting "racially charged" words and images at her.

"I want him to leave us alone," Morris said in December 2016, when she asked a judge for a no-stalking order against Misch, according to an official recording of the hearing obtained by the Burlington Free Press. "I want to feel safe."

The Twitter posts began a series of incidents both online and around Morris' home, many involving people other than Misch, that would leave Morris and her family scared and exasperated.

Police responded to complaints by Morris or her family at least 16 times in the last two years, records show. The incidents ranged from suspicious vehicles in the nearby cemetery, to kids knocking on their doors and windows at night, to racially-charged social media posts and the words "dead dead" found on a computer.

Bennington County prosecutors declined to charge anyone with a crime.

Misch, a self-described white nationalist, told the judge that he wanted his tweets to make Morris feel uncomfortable. He had tweeted at Morris with a caricature of a black person saying a profanity-laced comment about representing white residents of Bennington.

"I just found it incongruent that you have an African American woman representing a 96 percent white district," Misch said in court, according to a recording of the hearing. "It's a joke, your honor. It's a troll joke."

In the civil case, Vermont Superior Court Judge William Cohen ordered Misch to stay away from Morris and her son on the basis of two tweets. The no-stalking order would last a year.

Morris, however, never got her wish to feel safe.

In August 2018, the Democratic lawmaker dropped her bid for a third term in the Vermont House, and the Attorney General's Office announced it would investigate the online threats against her.

Then Morris resigned her seat entirely, saying she needed to help her husband recover from heart surgery and citing continued harassment.

The case raised questions about how well Bennington police, and the laws they enforce, protect people from online harassment or "trolling." "Trolling" is an Internet-age term describing the practice of making provocative, deliberately offensive posts to upset someone.

Morris' decision made national news, in no small part because her experience seemed at odds with Vermont's self-image as a progressive haven.

"Vermont has this myth that we are somehow different and better than the rest of the country," said Robert Appel, an attorney representing Morris and her husband.
"Unfortunately, in this regard, I don't think we are."

Can white Vermont handle racial trolling?

Morris and her family believe the local police response should have been "more prompt and vigorous," Appel said.

Morris also believes that state laws regarding threats and hate crimes were not strong enough to protect her.

"Our system is not sufficient, and our understanding of how these terrorism tactics are used is not sufficient," Morris said. "That is a deliberate tactic — to dance on that line between saying 'I will come and punch you in the face' to 'I'm just sort of going to make you fear that something might happen should I see you."

Bennington County State's Attorney Erica Marthage said she is proud of how her office and Bennington police handled what happened to Morris.

Vermont law sees a threat as something that a "reasonable person" would find threatening, as interpreted by police, prosecutors and a jury. Marthage found the evidence failed to rise to the level of a crime.

"We looked at the law, we looked at the behavior," she said. "Rather than file a charge based on my emotion about the situation, we looked at just the facts and what we could prove."

Bennington Police Chief Paul Doucette stands by his department's handling of the Morris case.

"All of the complaints filed by Representative Morris and her husband James have been investigated appropriately and efficiently," Doucette wrote in a September news release.

Doucette did not respond to requests for an interview, and Bennington Town Manager Stuart Hurd declined to comment for this article.


Bennington police challenged over racial disparities

Bennington is a quiet town of about 15,000 people, tucked into the corner of the state near the New York and Massachusetts borders.

As of 2017, 95.9 percent of the town's population was identified as "white alone," according to the U.S. Census Bureau. The "Black or African American alone" population was 1.2 percent.

"The most visible leaders we have in this community go generations back, to almost the founding of this community," Morris said. "So the diversity of voices and experiences is minute to almost nonexistent in some ways."

The Bennington Police Department has repeatedly been in the center of controversies over how the department handles race and racial bias.

On a summer night in 2013, Bennington Police Detective Peter Urbanowicz noticed a "large, African-American man" in the passenger seat of a cab that had stopped to ask for directions to a Chinese restaurant.

Urbanowicz testified that he knew officers were looking for a large, African-American man nicknamed "Sizzle," and so decided to search the passenger. The cab's passenger, Shamel Alexander, was not "Sizzle," but he did have 11 grams of heroin on him.

In 2016, the Vermont Supreme Court overturned Alexander's conviction, ruling that Bennington police lacked reasonable suspicion for the search.

But Chief Doucette brushed aside the idea that the ruling — an unusual step for the state's highest court — was a sign that Bennington police needed to change.

"Racial profiling does not go on within this agency," Doucette told WCAX reporter Eva McKend.

University of Vermont professor Stephanie Seguino and Cornell University professor Nancy Brooks released a study of police traffic stops the following year showing that black drivers in Bennington were searched more than five and a half times as often as white drivers. The disparity was widespread, showing up in the traffic stop records of 22 of the 24 Bennington officers the professors examined.

Frustrated by the police and the town's refusal to address bias issues, the Vermont chapter of the American Civil Liberties Union sued the town of Bennington, the police department and Doucette.

U.S. District Court Judge Geoffrey Crawford handed the civil rights advocates a crucial victory in summer of 2018, ruling that they had presented a reasonable case that Doucette and Bennington failed to train or supervise officers — and that failure amounted to deliberate indifference. The lawsuit is ongoing.


'I cannot live in fear'

Police records show a series of uncomfortable incidents that began during the 2016 election.

Morris saw the Twitter posts from Misch in August.

Two months later, someone entered Morris' home, possibly through an unlocked basement door. About 100 of her husband's ties were missing, several of them strewn around the historic town cemetery across the street from their home, according to a police report.

Police reports show no arrests in the case.

The next day, not far from Morris and Lawton's home, staff at the Democratic Party office in Bennington found a packet of racially-charged images that someone had slid under the door.

"My campaign sign was like front and center on the windows," Morris said. "It just didn't seem random."

A Democratic staffer also reported a harassing phone call. No arrests were announced.

Morris and her husband installed a camera and new lock at their home and changed their daily habits.


On election day in 2016, Morris was standing outside the back door of the Bennington Fire Department, her polling place, when she saw Misch watching her.

As Misch left the polling place, he stopped and looked at Morris for about 10 seconds, according to witness statements included in police reports. Then he took a few steps away before turning toward her again.

"I have been afraid and concerned for my safety throughout this ordeal," Morris wrote in her court application for no-stalking order against Misch. "I cannot live in fear anymore."

When the incident came up in civil court, Misch denied that he had stared at Morris for any length of time. He said he was worried that Morris was electioneering too close to the polls.

Without a lawyer by his side, Misch also made disparaging statements in court about Jewish people and African Americans. He defended the image that he had posted on Twitter.




A sworn statement written by Kiah Morris in 2016 (Photo: JESS ALOE/FREE PRESS)

Back in the Statehouse

Morris returned to Montpelier the following January with a new committee assignment, the House Judiciary Committee, and a new resolve to speak about issues of race.

"It just put a fire in me," Morris said. She became more pointed in her critiques and gave a floor speech in support of a Black Lives Matter resolution in 2017.

"This is not a question of whether some lives matter more than others," Morris said on the House floor, "but an acknowledgment, honoring and calling out of the disparate treatment of Black Vermonters and Black Americans."


Sha'an Mouliert, a community organizer and racial justice educator from the Northeast Kingdom, was in the House chamber to hear Morris' speech.

"For me to be in the room and see a black woman representative in this state ... talk about an impossible dream," Mouliert said.

Morris also proposed legislation that would require schools to change their curriculumto recognize marginalized groups, overhaul Vermont's hate crimes law, outlaw racial profiling by police and create an office to examine systemic racism in state government.

"We don't have time to hold hands and slowly wait for another day," Morris said in an interview. "The day was yesterday."

The final straws

Morris's no-stalking order against Misch lasted a year, ending in December of 2017.

"About a month or two after that, I was like — you know what? I'm now able to commence my trolling," Misch told the Burlington Free Press in an interview this winter.

Morris and her husband brought Misch's social media posts to the Bennington police in late July 2018. They described him as a "local neo-Nazi."


Bennington police officer Michael Sharshon looked at the posts and said there was no crime.

"The only action Misch claimed he would do is 'troll' Morris at a rally," Sharshon wrote in a police report.

Marthage later agreed when she reviewed the case.

"They were engaging in a lot of the conversation with him," Marthage said of the social media posts. "So it was a lot of back and forth. That to me, shows a lack of fear."

Morris disputes Marthage's claim that she and her husband engaged in "a lot of back and forth" with Misch. "It's a very odd comment to make from somebody who's supposed to be about protecting the public," Morris said.

Lawton also told the officer that when he turned on his computer, his name on his log-in screen had been replaced with the words "dead dead." Lawton and Morris took the message as a death threat, and they gave their computers to Bennington Police with the expectation that Vermont State Police experts would examine them.

But after Officer Sharshon consulted with a state police task force of computer experts, he wrote on Aug. 1 that the computers "would not be forensically analyzed."

One week later, on Aug. 7, Vermont Internet Crimes Taskforce Commander Matthew Raymond wrote a memo to clarify that state troopers were ready to examine the computer and believed it was possible to obtain evidence from an exam to advance an investigation.

"There was an impression that VT-ICAC recommended that no computer exam be conducted," he wrote. "I am writing this report to correct that impression."

Raymond added that he had tried to reach Doucette five days earlier, on Aug. 3, to speak about the case, leaving him a voicemail and sending him an email, but received no return phone call.

Morris said she spoke with Doucette on Aug. 13 and learned no action had been taken on the computers. She has described the inaction as one of the tipping points in her decision to leave public office.

On Aug. 27, Attorney General T.J. Donovan announced his office would work with the State Police and "appropriate computer forensic experts" to investigate online threats against Morris.

Leaving the Legislature

Ten days after she won the Democratic nomination for a third term as state representative, Morris announced she was dropping her campaign.

"The last two years have been emotionally difficult for many," Morris wrote on Facebook on Aug. 24. "Political discourse, and in particular within the sphere of social media has been divisive, inflammatory and at times, even dangerous."

In September, Morris and her husband reported that youths were repeatedly banging and knocking on their windows and doors at night and running off.

The police officer wrote in a report that the incidents appeared to be a "juvenile prank." Marthage declined to take action against the youths. Morris called them a strategic targeting of her home.

"It really was distressing to know that our chief of police thought it was just kids being kids," she said.

A few days later, Morris announced she was resigning from the Legislature immediately to care for her husband after his surgery.

"We face continued harassment and seek legal remedies to the harm endured," Morris wrote on Facebook. Her page flooded with comments of support.

"What I saw was a person who stood up against all odds and went as far as she could go without doing any more damage to herself," said Mouliert, the racial justice educator.

Misch said he felt a sense of satisfaction when he saw Morris had resigned.

"I thought I won. I did it," Misch said. "I didn't threaten her whatsoever, nothing like that, and I still accomplished what I wanted here."

Morris hopes that her experiences will prompt lawmakers to take another look at the line between free speech and criminal threatening.

Looking back, Morris has no regrets about her decision to join the Legislature and become a public figure.

But when she speaks to new legislators, Morris suggests that they learn how hate crimes work. Be prepared for doxxing, the tactic of posting someone's personal information online to stoke harassment.

And she cautions them: Think about your safety.

Thank you for reaching out on this. Please clarify your position with regard to your consent to search the laptop. Currently the laptop is in the custody of the Bennington Police Department and was scheduled to be transferred to the lab for examination on the morning of 8/22/2018 (tomorrow). The exam would not take long and the laptop could be returned relatively quickly.

To the extent that you are revoking consent and do not want the laptop examined by the lab, but rather intend to have it looked at by a local IT professional, please be aware that the chain of custody on the device would be broken and we would not be able to further pursue a criminal forensic investigation on the laptop. Local IT professionals are not certified to forensically recover data from digital devices and cannot be utilized as a replacement for our trained and certified digital forensic examiners.

We are willing to examine the device and ready to do so tomorrow. Please confirm whether you want us to proceed or if you want the laptop returned, in which case we cannot guarantee that we will be able to continue to assist in this part of the investigation. If you are revoking your consent, I will contact Bennington PD immediately and cancel the transport of the laptop to the lab.

- If the AGO is not satisfied with the response from Bennington PD regarding requests for follow-up then the AGO should contact VSP to discuss.
- Any future complaints, criminal or otherwise from Ms. Morris should be directed to Bennington PD assuming the complaints originated in Bennington. The VSP will not be the primary contact for complaints that occur in Bennington's jurisdiction.

I'm glad that we had the opportunity to talk this afternoon about the situation that Kiah and her family are presently facing trying to maintain their personal safety and security.

I am clear that the VSP was called by the AG's Office (AGO) to investigate ONLY the on-line death threats that were received by the family. When we first met on 9/6 (before James was taken to the Trayah was quite clear in stating the limited scope of the VSP's investigation. When we returned and met with Tpr. Eric Jollymore and Sgt. Henry Alberico on 10/3 for their investigative interviews of Kiah and James, Lt. Trayah reiterated the limited scope of VSP's investigation as directed by the AGO.

The behaviors of Max Misch reported by my client are quite disturbing and very frightening. However, as I explained to Kiah below, only a prosecutor can apply for an extreme risk protection order. Individuals having legal standing to pursue a stalking prevention order, BUT NOT an extreme risk protection order.

As we discussed this afternoon, I am copying both TJ and Bram Kranichfeld, Chief of the AGO's Criminal Division, on this email. Further, I have invited Kiah to reach out to the AGO on this matter given that she has little if any faith in her local police agency and the state's attorney.

I would be happy to facilitate the flow of information on to the AGO should that be required. However, simply googling will give one a flavor of why my clients are so anxious about this man walking around Bennington armed and making both open and veiled threats against persons of color, including my clients.

- 1. On August 22, 2018, Officer Sharshon transported the two computers to the Vermont Forensic Laboratory. VSP Detective Jollymore stopped working on other forensic examinations in order to immediately start the forensic examination of Mr. Lawton's computer the one reported to have had "dead dead" replace Mr. Lawton's user name. That analysis continued for several weeks and revealed that the username on the computer was associated with a Microsoft Live Account and an Outlook account of an unknown user.
- 2. On October 3, 2018, VSP Detective Henry Alberico and Det. Jollymore traveled to Bennington to conduct an in-person interview of Ms. Morris and Mr. Lawton, ^[1] who were accompanied by legal counsel. During the course of the interview, it was revealed that the laptop computer with the "dead dead" user name had recently been purchased by Mr. Lawton from a local resident.
- 3. On October 10, 2018, Det. Alberico interviewed the person from whom Mr. Lawton had purchased the laptop. During the interview, Det. Alberico learned that this person's 10-year-old son's screenname when he played online video games on his Xbox was "dead dead" and this screenname, which was associated with his mother's Microsoft cloud account, continued to be synced with Mr. Lawton's laptop after he had purchased it.
- 4. It was this accidental synchronization that led the username on Mr. Lawton's laptop to appear as "dead dead." In other words, the VSP investigation established that the laptop incident did not involve any form of threat or unlawful activity.

Additionally, pursuant to 1 V.S.A. § 317(c)(5)(A)(iii) some information has been redacted in order to protect against a possible unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.

We thank you for your patience and understanding as we have worked to meet your request and abide by our obligations under the Vermont Public Records Act.

NARRATIVE:

On August 29, 2018, I was assigned a "special investigation" and was provided with documents from an investigation that was conducted by the Bennington Police Department. It should be noted that all of Bennington Police Department's documents will be included with this case for review.

had filed a complaint with the Bennington Police Department on July 27, 2018 (Bennington PD Case #18BN05584). Lawton had spoke with Officer Michael Sharshon (Bennington Police Department) in regards to issues he and his wife (Morris) were having with someone he referred to as a "local neo-nazi." The individual was identified as Max Misch and was said to be causing issues for Morris and Lawton online.

Through further discussion Officer Sharshon learned that Mish had been targeting Morris on social media (Facebook & Twitter) and making unpleasant comments. Print outs of the comments being referred to by Lawton are included with this case, however, the conversations do not appear to be in their entirety.

Lawton then stated that he had signed onto his computer and discovered that the "sign on name" had been changed. Lawton explained that this sign on name typically shows "James Lawton" however, when he signed on he found it to say "dead dead."

During Lawton's conversation with Officer Sharshon, he explained that Morris was currently in legislative session (Morris is a VT representative) and she had been speaking with the Vermont State Police (VSP). Lawton informed Sharshon that he believed VSP would take the computer and asked if he should bring it to the Bennington Police Department and Sharshon informed him, "no." Officer Sharson directed Lawton to speak with Morris and inquire about what VSP wanted done with the computer.

On July 30, 2018, Officer Sharshon learned that Lawton had brought his computer to the Bennington Police Department. Officer Sharson contacted Detective Trooper Eric Jollymore (VSP TIU) and documented in his report that "...that situation that Lawton encounter is possible, however, it would require whoever did it to have an advanced degree of technical knowledge of computers. It was determined that the computers would not be forensically analyzed."
