Thank you for your public records request dated December 8, 2021.

You requested documents regarding a "Petition" to the FDA dated October 21, 2021 and signed by 23 Attorneys General, and specifically:

- Documents that provided a basis for the Petition, including but not limited to meeting agenda or notes where the Petition or the presence of heavy metals in baby food products were discussed; drafts of the Petition; and related communications amongst the Attorneys General;
- Internal or external communications sent to or received by the Attorneys General regarding action levels for inorganic arsenic, lead, cadmium, and/or mercury in infant and toddler foods;
- Internal or external communications sent to or received by the Attorneys General regarding an action level for inorganic arsenic in infant rice cereal that is lower than the existing action level of 100 ppb;
- Internal or external communications sent to or received by the Attorneys General regarding industry guidance that testing of finished baby food products for inorganic arsenic, lead, cadmium, and mercury is a preventive control that should be performed by baby food manufacturers;
- Documents that provided a basis for Appendix A in the Petition relating to the presence of inorganic arsenic in baby food snack products where rice or rice flour is listed as the first, second, or third ingredient, including but not limited to test results; underlying data, analyses, or reports; or communications amongst the Attorneys General and/or with the FDA; Documents that provided a basis for Appendix B in the Petition relating to the presence of cadmium in baby food snack products where rice or rice flour is listed as the

- first, second, or third ingredient, including but not limited to test results; underlying data, analyses, or reports; or communications amongst the Attorneys General and/or with the FDA; and
- Documents that provided a basis for Appendix C in the Petition relating to the presence of cadmium in pureed baby food products where sweet potatoes or carrots are listed as the first, second, or third ingredient, including but not limited to test results; underlying data, analyses, or reports; or communications amongst the Attorneys General and/or with the FDA.
