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1 But unfortunately this didn't end there.
2 It wasn't going to be so easy for [REDACTED] to back away
3 from this because another friend of hers, a girl named
4 [REDACTED] wanted her to say something to the
5 school personnel. And [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] went and
6 they talked to the school secretary. The school
7 secretary contacted the assistant principal who contacted
8 the social worker for the school system.

9 The assistant principal and the school
10 social worker then came and talked to [REDACTED] and
11 [REDACTED]. The social worker and the assistant principal
12 contacted [REDACTED] mother. She came down and was told
13 what [REDACTED] was saying, and a few days later [REDACTED]
14 mother contacted the police.

15 And the police came and spoke with
16 [REDACTED] and she had to tell them what she had been
17 saying. And by now, [REDACTED] is stuck. This is out of
18 her hands. She has no control over this story anymore.
19 The railroad has started and she is just a passenger.

20 Now the police did a number of things to
21 try and obtain some evidence against Mr. Forte. They got
22 a warrant to search his house in Vermont and they did
23 search the house in Vermont and they found nothing,
24 nothing that indicates that he did anything to [REDACTED]

25 They had him arrested. And the night he

1 cleared it up. But perhaps I am mistaken. Would you ask
2 the appropriate question?

3 BY MR. LAWRENCE:

4 Q [REDACTED] we have been talking about the February
5 vacation?

6 MS. ST. HELAIRE: Her name is [REDACTED].

7 MR. LAWRENCE: Sorry, I hope I don't do
8 that the other way.

9 BY MR. LAWRENCE:

10 Q [REDACTED]?

11 A Yes.

12 MS. ST. HELAIRE: He still hasn't said
13 which night.

14 THE COURT: Give him a chance.

15 BY MR. LAWRENCE:

16 Q Let me check in here and see when we talked about

17 Q She wanted you to talk to a counselor, but you went
18 to the school secretary?

21 A -- the only reason why we talked to the secretary
22 was because the counselor wasn't in.

23 Q And the secretary was Mrs. Clotts?

24 A Right.

25 Q And Mrs. Clotts, she contacted the assistant

1 principal, Dr. Adams?

3 Q And then Dr. Adams and a school social worker who is
4 Mrs. Satzman came and talked to you and [REDACTED]

7 saying, they contacted your mother?

11 Q And you had to say the same thing over again -- or
12 actually they told your mother, right?

20 Q And you told them what you had been telling
21 everybody else?

23 Q And you spoke with Detective Wimmer; that is who you
24 call Cookie?

4 identification. Do you recognize that?

21 So I went over to the middle school to talk with the
22 student.

23 Q And who was the student?

24 A The student was [REDACTED] And I talked with

25 [REDACTED] The assistant principal was with me and a

1 friend of [REDACTED] who had encouraged her to talk to
2 the adults about it to get some help for it.

3 Q Did you discuss with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] what she said
4 the defendant did to her?

5 A Yes, she told me what had happened. I asked her,
6 you know, to tell me what had happened. And she told me
7 what had happened.

8 Q How long was the conversation that you had with her?

9 A Well, it was very tearful with a good deal of
10 interruptions. But I would say that she and I talked
11 about for about an hour.

12 Q And how was she reacting during the time period that
13 she was discussing these?

14 A She was very upset. It was very difficult for her
15 to talk about what happened. She didn't feel like she
16 was going to be believed. And most of all, she really
17 felt extremely ashamed. And it was very hard for her to
18 say the words, to talk about what the situation was.

19 Q Did she eventually tell you?

20 A Yes, she did.

21 Q And what did she tell you?

22 A She told me that she had gone to Vermont over the
23 February ski vacation with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and [REDACTED].
24 And that during that time, several times during the time
25 that she was up there, Mr. Forte had come up behind her

1 the validity, the truth of what --

2 THE COURT: We don't want you to go on too
3 much further with that.

4 BY MR. LAWRENCE:

5 Q Mrs. Satzman?

6 A Yes.

7 Q You first met [REDACTED] on April 8, 1987?

8 A That's correct.

23 Q And this is the only time that you have ever spoken
24 with [REDACTED] about the specific allegations against
25 Mr. Forte?

1 A About the information and what happened that night
2 yes, that is true.

3 Q Now you have talked with her about other things,
4 haven't you?

5 A Yes, I have.

6 Q And you have talked to her about coming to court?

7 MS. ST. HELAIRE: Objection. May we
8 approach the bench?

9 THE COURT: Yes.

10 MS. ST. HELAIRE: Your Honor, there are
11 several reasons we are up here. First of all what we are
12 looking for is I would like an offer of proof as to why
13 Mr. Lawrence is going on with this. And I think I know.

14 Secondly, it is beyond the scope of direct
15 if he is going to get into other conversations that
16 [REDACTED] had with Sarah Satzman. Because she has been
17 seeing her on another basis. He is trying to --

18 THE COURT: Excuse me, as a therapist?

19 MS. ST. HELAIRE: It has nothing to do
20 with anything in this case. He is trying to make some
21 inference that she is from a broken home and making all
22 this up. And it has nothing to do with this. I would
23 like to know where Mr. Lawrence is going with this
24 questioning.

25 MR. LAWRENCE: It's true that [REDACTED]

████ and █████ continued to be friends after this February vacation, continued to spend time at each other's house. At least until the end of March, and then they had a fight and they stopped being friends. And then █████ started telling the other girls at school that █████ █████ had done bad things. And this is going--these rumours are going around the school yard. As Mrs. Gualandi told you, there was a war - girls on each side. And █████ the first time that anything was said to an adult, was when one of these school girls, █████, took █████, spoke to the school secretary, and then the social worker was brought in, the Assistant Principal; then her mother was brought in; and then the police were brought in. This is not a case of delayed reporting. This is a 12 year old making a false accusation that she doesn't really understand -- she's only 12 years old. And then it's completely out of her control. With--another contradiction that I pointed out is, where was █████ when these things were supposedly happening? █████ told you that █████ was right next to her, 6 inches away, and that █████ is a restless sleeper, a light sleeper. The physical closeness of █████ and █████ makes this completely unbelievable. Supposedly, on each of these nights with █████ right next to █████, █████ is getting on the floor with █████, moving her around, █████ (as Ms. St. Helaire pointed out), in a █████. And he's doing all of this while his daughter is 6 inches away. 6 inches--6 inches away. And

Last year, during Spring break in 1986, my friend [REDACTED] invited me to go to Florida with her and her parents. I asked my mother and she said yes. On a Thursday Mrs. Forte and [REDACTED] and I drove to Florida, which took about two days. Mr. Forte had already driven down and was waiting for us on their very large boat. I stayed about a week. During that time Mr. Forte, whenever Mrs. Forte was not around, would wrestle and play the "tickle game" with me. He would also [REDACTED]. When he would tickle and wrestle he would also [REDACTED]. I knew that when [REDACTED] it was not an accident I was embarrassed and uncomfortable but I didn't know what to do. Mr. Forte would then whisper in my ear, things like "you're a pretty little girl", stupid things like that. I didn't tell anyone about this until about two weeks ago when I was talking to [REDACTED], who also had a problem with Mr. Forte. We decided to tell someone in school, so we went to the office and told the school nurse. I then told my mother.

DETAILS

On 4/15/87 the undersigned Officer was informed by ROSALIE SALEMME that [REDACTED] may have been sexually abused. MRS. SALEMME indicated that the incident may have occurred in the State of Vermont, but that she was not positive on all of the facts at this time. She indicated that the man who is believed to have committed the acts also resides in Suffolk County and that [REDACTED] has also had contact with him in Suffolk County. MRS. SALEMME stated that she was apprised of this problem by representatives of the [REDACTED] - Bonnie Sue Adams, the Assistant Principal, and Sarah Satzmon, School Counselor. MRS. SALEMME requested the assistance of the Sex Crime Squad with interviewing [REDACTED] and a date of 4/20/87 was agreed upon.

MRS. SALEMME indicated that there may have been three separate incidents with the man known as LEONARD FORTE, and that they may all have occurred in the State of Vermont.

The undersigned requested that MRS. SALEMME bring [REDACTED] to the Stony Brook University Hospital to have [REDACTED] examined by a physician prior to our scheduled interview.

The undersigned was also advised that a second female, [REDACTED], may also have been sexually abused by the man, LEONARD FORTE. [REDACTED] was contacted and informed of the inquiry and she also requested that [REDACTED] be interviewed by our office. The same night of April 20, 1987 was agreed upon.

This case is to remain ACTIVE.

DETAILS

On 4/20/87 the undersigned, along with Detective Carolyn Wimmer #722, of Command 3330, responded to [REDACTED] New York, to interview [REDACTED]

The undersigned interviewed ROSALIE SALEMME and was advised that she had learned nothing new. She informed me that if [REDACTED] was sexually abused, she would want to have an investigation conducted.

Detective Carolyn Wimmer interviewed [REDACTED] and was informed that acts of sexual abuse, [REDACTED] were performed upon her by LEONARD FORTE. Detective Wimmer was also informed that these acts occurred in the State of Vermont, during [REDACTED] mid-winter school recess in February of 1987.

This interview with [REDACTED] was reduced to a handwritten statement and signed by both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] ROSALIE SALEMME.

MRS. SALEMME was advised that the information [REDACTED] has disclosed would be presented to our Supervisors and the District Attorney's Office for review. I advised her that at this time there was no crime committed in Suffolk County, New York, and that we would ascertain the procedure on how to contact the State of Vermont.

On 4/20/87 the undersigned, along with Detective Wimmer, responded to [REDACTED] to interview [REDACTED]

The undersigned interviewed [REDACTED] and was advised that although [REDACTED] told her something had happened, she was not sure of what.

Detective Wimmer interviewed [REDACTED] and was informed that during a school break in the Spring of 1986, she was invited to go to Florida with the FORTE family. [REDACTED] stated that during the Spring vacation, and while they were staying on a large boat in the State of Florida, MR. FORTE would sexually abuse her [REDACTED]

Detective Wimmer reduced this interview with [REDACTED] to statement form, which was signed by both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]

We informed [REDACTED] that, at this time, we did not know where this investigation was going to progress and that we would have to confer with our Supervisors before proceeding any further.

The undersigned, along with Detective Carolyn Wimmer, were also informed during the above two interviews that several other juvenile females have accompanied LEONARD FORTE and [REDACTED] on trips to Vermont.
