I write in response to your public records act request dated May 16, 2022, in which you requested:

It is my understanding that our office has provided you with a list of all use of force incidents and police shootings reviewed by the Attorney General's office between 12/1/2021 and 5/16/2022. Please see the attached records in response to your request for information on use of force investigations on the dates listed above.

Please note that significant portions of these records have been redacted. Pursuant to 1 V.S.A. § 317(c)(5)(A)(iii), records are exempt if disclosure "could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy." The records you request contain information that could lead to the identification of victims and witnesses, including where they work and live, and their personal and medical information. Further, these records indicate that a prosecution review was conducted regarding police officers involved and no criminal charges were filed against them. Therefore, under this exemption, their privacy interests must be considered as well.

Please also be advised that, pursuant to 13 V.S.A. § 7607, the response to an inquiry from any member of the public regarding a sealed record shall be that "NO CRIMINAL RECORD EXISTS." Any records provided in response to your request comply with this statutory

provision.

If you have any questions or need any further information, please let me know. Please also be advised that to the extent that this letter constitutes a denial of your request, you may appeal to the Deputy Attorney General. Any appeal should be in writing and addressed to:

identified as . I was advised a woman by the Hartford of the Springfield Correctional Facility reviewed an e-mail sent on 1/2/2020 at 0247 hours to inmate from where she alleged she was assaulted by police officers on 1/2/2020. The notification of this information was sent to Detective on 1/3/2020.
After receiving this information Detective The original e-mail from indicated that it was Springfield Police Officers that advised assaulted her. It was determined that Springfield Police had nothing to do with this incident. The incident appeared to be related to the Hartford Police where was on the morning of 1/1/2020 into 1/2/2020.
On 1/3/2020, Detective said he had attempted to contact at 3 telephone numbers. He advised the numbers were not active or wrong numbers.
Detective said he contacted Sergeant of the St. Johnsbury Barracks to see if a Trooper could be sent to her last known address in

On 1/6/20 requested that I assist with an ongoing investigation. I was requested to contact the Cumberland Farms at in Wilder, VT and retrieve video of an Hartford PD
I contacted the store and spoke with an assistant manager. He viewed the camera's for the date and times given and located two camera views. He advised that he would burn the views to a disc that I could pick up. At approximately 1530 hours I retrieved the disc. I watched the video in the store to confirm that all available camera views of the incident had been recorded onto the disc.
On 1/7/20 I copied the information on the disc to a Onedrive folder and sent a link to so he could have access to the video. I installed the video player and reviewed the video for documenting in this report.
In the video I could see a car parked to the right of the main store entry door. A female walks out of the store and enters the driver side of the car. A short time later a police car comes into the parking lot and goes around the pumps parking at the end pump with the front end of the cruiser pointing at the car with the female inside. An officer exits the cruiser and walks towards the front door and off screen. Two officers return to the view and go to the car with the female in the driver seat. Both approach the driver's door and the door is opened. These officers appear to speak with the female for several minutes. One officer is then seen reaching into the vehicle in what appears to be an attempt to remove the female from the vehicle. The female is removed from the vehicle and is stood up. Based on the video view the female does not appear to struggle or resist once removed from the vehicle (video is grainy).
Upon completion of viewing the video I placed the original copy in an envelope

On April 14, 2018 at approximately 1020 hours dispatcher advised me by telephone contact of a walk in complaint in the front lobby at the barracks. Dispatch advised me that the female party, stopped to file a complaint about the Grand Isle County Sheriff's Dept after she was directed by the court to comne and report the matter to the Vermont State Police.
I walked out to the lobby and met with as her significant other in person.
While interviewing in an interview room at the barracks (audio and video on) proceeded to advise me that on or around March 17, 2018 at approximately 6pm the Grand Isle County Sheriff's Dept. as well as Williston P.D. executed a seach warrant at for bad checks on a closed account. advised me that during the course of the warrant she was grabbed in the left arm by and that he took her to the ground hard. advised me that after her face hit her tile floor breaking her tile, put his hands under her head and ther wiped the tile away from her face. advised that she was roughed up.
While was at the barracks, I took the following sworn written statement from her which she filled out herself (spelling and grammar not corrected):
"On March 17 around 6pm the Grand Isle Shiff and the Williston Police exacuted a seach warret. I was standing in the hallway on the side of and he stood on his side and grabed my arm and said I punched him and I did not do that my arms were folded up on my chest he ruffed me up like a yoyo into the wall and on the floor face first hit the floor and then put his hand under my head and whiped the stone off my face, and when I was in the office got in my face and said got you. While was in the interview room at the Williston Barracks I asked her if the red 1/4" cut on her left cheek area was from hitting the tile floor. advised that it was. A digital photo was taken of the injury which is on file at VSP Williston with the above sworn written statements. I provided and my business card and copies of the statements they completed. They were advised the original statements and photo would be on file at the barracks. I advised that my supervisor was aware of the incident and that I would brief her further of the specifics of her complaint. I advised that she should receive a call back a VSP Trooper or investigator by Monday at the latest. and thanked me for my time.
After and left the barracks I forwarded an e-mail outlining complaint, the above statements, as well as digital photo of 's facial injury. I also briefed of the call via telephone contact. advised me that she would advise of the complaint. I was later advised by that she would call and inform her that someone from VSP would be getting in touch with her probably on Monday. advised me by telephone contact that would be made as to how the complaint by and a decision would be made as to how the complaint would be handled.


